Old Business

Approved:

- Reopening the church. The daily 6:30 AM Mass has about 40 coming daily. The daily 8:15 Mass has about 35 people attending. On Sunday, the number 1 attended Mass was 7:30, then 9:00 and 4:30 next, then 11:00 AM. The lowest was 5:00 PM Sunday. There was plenty of room at all Masses to maintain social distancing. Resurrection Hall was not needed for overflow. One little boy waved to Father McCabe when Father got on the altar. Could probably double attendance before going to Resurrection Hall for the 11:00 and 5:00 PM. Trying to keep all masses going.
- Going in and out of Mass was smooth. Holy Communion went well. In the future the ciborium will be covered to prevent the spread of airborne virus. Acolytes need to receive Communion either first or last and then purify their hands with Purell. It is strongly encouraged that the people wear masks throughout Mass. Ron Clinch recommended that we require that they wear a mask. Grace Raun suggested we have a message in the vestibule encouraging them to wear a mask.
- Monday morning at 7:30 there is a short communion service in church that is open to anyone to receive communion.

- Confessions. There is steady stream of folks to the Family Room for Confession. There are people coming for confession on Saturday from 3:00 to 4:20. Some parishioners are coming by appointment.
- School options for the fall are being reviewed. Perhaps 2 days a week in the school. Or maybe starting school in August and having the semester break in November. How will lunch work? How will the classroom work? No decisions yet. Need guidance from the government experts.
- Baptism is one at a time. •
- Marriages can now have over 10 people present. No receptions. •
- Funerals, were only a mini-service at the grave site. We are now able to have Masses in the church with 6 feet spacing, no reception lines, no food, no receptions.

New Business

Amy Zeleny has been formally accepted as the new parish trustee.

Committee Reports

Finance

Ann reported on this. She is working with the end of School, and notification of school tuition for next year. The Federal loan was received. Union Bank guided us on getting the loan. The threshold for a federal audit is \$2,000,000. Our loan was for about \$600,000. Of that 97% went to payroll, and 3% went to utilities. These are well within the guidelines of the government.

Stewardship

The charity and stewardship appeal has started. Those that have contributed in the past have already got their cards in the mail (680 families). The second phase will be going out soon to those that give to the church, but not the Stewardship appeal. Then a third phase will go to the parishioners that don't give currently. A video is being done for this weekend on our web site and e-mail explaining the appeal and its benefit to the local parish. 80% of the funds donated by the parish come back to the parish to help with our expenses. St. Vincent De Paul has been helping the poor with our parish giving.

Pastoral Council


