Committee Reports

Finance

Committee Chair: Jim Essay

- Members present: Fr. McCabe, Ann Wackel, Scott Gubbels, Angie Muhleisen, Doris Robertson, Brian Morrow, Craig Pytleski, Jim Sizemore, Michael Henkenius, and Jim Essay
- Fr. McCabe opened the meeting with a prayer
- Ann Wackel handed out the detailed profit and loss reports for both the school and the church along with a
 year-end balance sheet. She then highlighted the fiscal year end results:
 - School
 - The transfer from the parish to the school was close to the budgeted amount. The actual amount was approximately \$29,000 over the budgeted amount
 - Total enrollment for last fiscal year was 414 in K-8 and 44 in preschool. 2022-2023 is 425 in K-8 and 63 in preschool. Preschool has expanded this year to include an all-day every-day option, and it is full.
 - Hot lunch was COVID funded in 2021-2022 for all families. It will not be in 2022-2023
 - Church
 - The envelope tithe was lower than what was budgeted for last year. Most of the difference was made up by CANA donations and the CANA match.
 - Many facilities projects were completed last year, many from designated donations. Projects included:

- School/church/rectory window cleaning: \$3,562
- The school budget was approved last February. The church budget will be sent to the finance council by email in the coming week
- Jim Essay, who is a Villa Marie advisory board member, asked the Finance Council for input and whether it would be reasonable to have the parish consider allowing Villa Marie School in Waverly an opportunity for a special collection at St. Joseph. Villa Marie is a special needs school funded mostly by donations. Villa Marie is considered a "pro-life" cause. In past years. St. Joseph's, being a stewardship parish, helped support the now non-existent St. Mary's and Sacred Heart Schools. Reportedly, St. Michael's parish is open to allowing a special collection at their parish and they are wanting to involve other parishes in the effort. A planned meeting with the Villa Marie finance committee and representatives from St. Joseph's and St. Michael's, including Fr. McCabe and Fr. Borowiak, will be held in the near future to discuss the pros and cons of this matter. There was a positive response from the Finance Council to have Fr. McCabe pursue this further.
 - Villa Marie has a cost of about \$35,000 per student.
 - Total budget is approximately \$650,000 annually.
 - Tuition collected is about \$70,000.
 - Various fundraising events held each year but they still fall short.
 - o Asked Parish Council to consider a special collection to help subsidize costs
 - o Discussion ensued; feedback was positive

- Introductions
- Junior High Parent survey
 - o Good summer meetings with JH team
 - Lots of info already gathered and posted on website, including electives and how they work
 - Math placement info still needed handout at back-to-school nights and on web
 - Positive feedback from parents already with info going out before school started, especially about electives and athletics
- Website functionality Carrie and Mike to collaborate
- JH back-to-school session being led by Ben Kubistek; will take place in the gym then to separate classrooms if parents would like to talk more with teachers one-on-one

New Business:

Duane Becker

- Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)
 - There have been some questions from parents regarding numbers and the reasoning for the program

- Kevin: looking toward the future, trying to make faith more personal for students so they stay in the Catholic education system and stay active in the church beyond our school, beyond Pius X, etc.; making faith about more than memorizing prayers and doctrine; for all students whether they're St. Joe's students or not; focused on younger students, especially early elementary grades
- Parents unsure what it's about and who it's for; we're starting with 2nd grade and working toward making it available to younger grades
- Team includes Megan Dolton and Megan McDermott, parents of St. Joseph School students, Megan Pytleski and Courtney Verhoeff, parents of children who do not attend St. Joe's School, as well as some other parents in the parish who have been assisting the process.
- Currently, Sr. John Marion, 2nd grade teacher, is the only person at St. Joe's trained in CGS which is why
 we're starting with 2nd grade this year
- Carrie suggested more detailed info for bulletin, possibly an insert including testimonies from families who already know CGS
- o Sr. Mary Angela will collect FAQs and forward them to the CGS team
- Video testimonials were proposed
- Some parents have voiced concern that CGS is taking the pace of Religion class, but the reality is that it will be only one day a week
- Starting CGS isn't meant to suggest that what we already to for religious education is lacking, just another opportunity for students to own their faith
- Sr. Mary Angela noted that she has been reading a book "From Christendom to Apostolic Mission" that relates well to the principles CGS is aiming for
- Some apprehension among parents re: changes indicated in summer letter
 - Moving away from compartmentalization of subjects
 - o Inviting students to get involved and own their education and catechesis
- Full class Mass schedule requested before school starts
 - Semester's schedule sent to everyone'
 - Include in bulletin and newsletter
 - o Create a page on the website for it?
 - Teachers to inform parents; direct parents to ask teachers if they haven't already
 - o Include in back-to-school nights next week
- Beyond the Bell
 - Job is posted in several areas
 - One candidate interested; qualifications being reviewed before meeting with candidate
 - If we hire this candidate, BTB could start as soon as the end of 1st quarter or after 1st semester; difficult to determine timeline right now
 - Other options were explored but weren't viable for us; other organizations are struggling to find workers and can't take on any additional students
 - o Participation numbers by end of last school year: 30 students; pre-COVID numbers were around 50
